Chapter LIV: Vezot haBracha (Deut. 33:1–34:12)

Essay 1. A blessing upon 12 tribes

"[רֹאמַר ה' מִסִּינֵי בָּא" כְּתַב בַּעַל הַטּוּרִים שֶׁהַפְּסוּק הָתְחִיל בְּנִי"ו וּמְסַיֵּים בְּנָי"ו, לוֹמַר שֶׁבָּרַךְ י"ב שְׁבָטִים. מַקְשִׁים לָמָה לֹא צִיֵּין זֶה עַל פָּסוּק "וְזֹאת הַבְּרָכָה" שֶׁגַּם הוּא מַתְחִיל וּמְסַיֵּים בְּנִי"ו, וְשָׁם מְבוֹאָר בּוֹ לְשׁוֹן בְּרָכָה, מַה שֶׁאֵין כֵּן בְּפָסוּק זֶה. אֶלָא לְפִי שֶׁעַקֵּר הַבְּרָכָה בָּאָה בִּזְכוּת הַתּוֹרָה, וּבְפָסוּק זֶה מְבוֹאָר נְתִינַת הַתּוֹרָה "מִסִּינִי בָּא" וְכוּ' "מִימִינוֹ אֵשׁ דְּת לָמוֹ", לָכֵן צְיֵין דְּוְקָא בְּפָסוּק זֶה.

"[Moses] said: 'The L-rd came from Sinai, and rose from Seir unto them; He shined forth from Mount Paran, and He came from the myriads holy, at His right hand was a fiery law unto them" (Deut. 33:2). The ba'al haTurim¹ wrote that the verse begins with the letter vav and concludes with a vav, as if to say the [G-d] blessed 12 tribes. That is, vav is the sixth letter of the alphabet and represents the number six, and adding together the two vavs would yield 12, which is the number of the tribes.

[People] question why he didn't point this out on the first verse of the parasha, "This is the <u>blessing</u> with which Moses, the man of G-d, bade the Israelites farewell before he died" (Deut. 33:1), which also begins and concludes with a vav. There, in Deut. 33:1, the verse is explained in the language of blessing, something that is not so for this verse under consideration, Deut. 33:2. Rather, because the principal blessing comes in the merit of the Torah, and in this verse, Deut. 33:2, the giving of the Torah is explained: "coming from Sinai," etc., "at His right hand was a fiery law unto them," therefore, [the ba'al haTurim] specifically pointed out this verse.
