Chapter LIX: Kohelet (Ecclesiastes)

Essay 17. Well-treated slaves

"I have seen slaves on horseback, and nobles walking on the ground like slaves" (Eccl. 10:17). The Tosafists wrote in tractate Kiddushin (page 20a, "One who acquires a Hebrew slave is like one who acquires a master for himself"), that if he only has one cushion, how should he act? If he sleeps on it, he fails to fulfil what Scripture says, "But should he say to you, 'I do not want to leave you'—for he loves you and your household and he is happy with you . . ." (Deut. 15:16).

[Abaye explains that the term "with you" in Deut. 15:16 means that the slave must be] with you [i.e., treated as your equal], with regard to food, [and] with you with regard to drink. You should not eat fine bread [while] he eats inferior bread. You [should not] drink old wine [while] he drinks [inferior] new wine. You [should not] sleep on soft sheets [while] he sleeps on the ground. From here the Sages stated: One who acquires a Hebrew slave [is considered] like one who acquires a master for himself.

If he doesn't sleep on [the cushion] and neither does his servant, there is behavior characteristic of Sodom in this action. He must necessarily give it to his servant.

This is the point that King Solomon, peace be upon him, wished to hint at here, "I have seen ministers who only had one horse, who were obliged to give it to their servants, while they walked upon the ground."
